

REGIMENTAL CAMP FLAG

GENERAL

- 1. The tradition of having a Regimental camp flag is longstanding. Flags have often been flown to identify individuals and groups. A camp flag is one that is flown to identify the location of a headquarters or boundaries of units, and can include command, formation, branch, and unit flags.
- 2. In addition to the Infantry Branch flag, the Directorate of History and Heritage has recognized official camp flags for infantry regiments of the Canadian Armed Forces, this includes our camp flag. A listing can be located at the public DHH website. On 11 June 2009, the Director of Infantry approved the current camp flag for the Princess of Wales' Own Regiment. The previous, unofficial camp flag, of a gold lettered PWOR with the Regimental Crest in place of the letter 'O' on a maroon background is no longer authorized to be flown.

PWOR CAMP FLAG

- The approved Regimental Camp Flag includes the following;
 - a. The centre of the camp flag has the Regimental Crest,
 - b. The background of the camp flag is composed of the three regimental colours, those being:
 - i. Red
 - ii. Blue
 - iii. Gold
 - c. The blue colour composes the top and bottom quarters of the camp flag, the red colour provides the largest band centered on the flag. A small gold band separates the middle red band from each blue band. The Regimental Crest is centered in the flag filling the

WHEN USED

8. The Regimental Camp Flag can be flown by any unit or subunit of the Regiment whenever it is tactically appropriate, including non-tactical bivouacs, headquarters units, special events, sporting events and in offices. When privately purchased from the Kit Shop, it can be flown by individual members of the Regimental Family in private settings as would be befitting any other organizational flag and according to the accept rules of flying a flag. The Camp Flag can also be utilized as a presentation item in appropriate circumstances.



MODIFICATIONS

9. The Regimental Camp Flag may only be modified to include official unit and subunit designations. This would consist of a letters in the lower left corner indicating the local hadquarters, such as 1st Bn, A Coy, or CSS Coy. The image of the Camp Flag is included below.
