



## BATTLE HONOURS

1. As one of Canada's oldest military organizations, members of the Princess of Wales' Own Regiment have seen action in all Canadian conflicts, including those predating Confederation. The Regiment holds dear to its own service, as well as perpetuating the military service of the citizen soldiers of Kingston, including the Volunteer Militia Rifle Companies of Kingston, the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion Canadian Militia, and the 21<sup>st</sup>, 59<sup>th</sup>, and 253<sup>rd</sup> Battalions of the Canadian Expeditionary Force.
