Military historians, biographers and news reporters have often written about the infantryman, who achieved his objective and is satisfied within himself that he can do no more. It is then that he will pause for a while and reflect on two things.

One is of the many memories that he will take from this place. The other is the fact that he has left something of himself on this spot. After doing this, he will pick up his pack, and move on to the next objective in his life.

So it is with one of the members of our Regimental Family. A man who joined our Unit in the late 1960's. He came to us as a healer, our Medical Officer. In this capacity he would look after us with care, compassion, and empathy. He immediately became a role model for young recruits because his campaign medals indicated that he had been tempered and tested in WWII, and jumper's wings on his chest were a sign that he had fought as a paratrooper.

This man was welcomed, loved and respected by everyone in the Regiment and it's Association. All ranks recognized and admired this complete infantryman who could function ably on land, sea and air.

To this man who came up through the ranks to attain the highest appointment in the Regiment, Honorary Colonel, we say this: "Colonel Einarson, it is a privilege to have known you."

To your beautiful wife and supportive family, we give our sincere thanks for sharing you with us for all these years. For this we will be forever grateful.

So to you Dos Einarson, as you pause and contemplate your achievements, we hope that you will have many fond memories of us, which you will recall very often. As for us, we know that you have left a part of yourself in the heart and history of this regiment and its Association.

Association Participates in March of Dimes

\$19,000 was the final total that was raised for the Ontario March of Dimes through the eighth annual "PWOR March for the March of Dimes" held on March 7th, 1998. There were 364 participants representing the Princess of Wales' Own Regiment, the PWOR Army Cadets, 58th Air Squadron Cadets, the Reserve Electronic Warfare Squadron, 79 Communication Regiment, the PWOR Association, the Canadian Forces School of Communications and Electronics, the 1st Canadian Headquarters Division & Signal Regiment and Canadian Forces Recruiting Centre. Mayor Gary Bennett kept pace all along the route. CFLY Radio and Pepsi were major sponsors.

The march this year started from the Air Force Club at Norman Rogers Airport onto Front Road, and continued along King St. to Union St. onto University Avenue, to Princess St. through the downtown core, to Ontario St., up Market St. to King St., over to Queen St., onto Montreal St. to the Armoury. Following this route gave the Military a higher profile with the public. The marchers were very visible. The PWOR Pipe and Drum Band piped the marchers to the Armoury.

The Kingston O.P.P. and the Kingston City Police Force escorted the marchers along the 12 km route. Thousand Island REACT helped with safety and crowd control. Town Crier Chris Whyman was unable to attend so the mayor declared March of Dimes Day at the Market Square.

A free pancake breakfast was introduced this year. The field kitchen from the 1CDHSR was put to great use. It opened at 9:30 am and was in constant use till 1:00 pm.

Local celebrities flipped all morning under the well trained eyes of the military cooks. LCol Weicker of 1CDHSR, LCol Hamel of CFSCE, LCol Thibault of 79 Com and Capt Chabot of Recruiting were among the famous flippers.

Jennifer Fielding who was the Grand Marshall rode in the CFLY van with OMOD councillor Debbie Hill. Jennifer is one of the many people that utilize the services and programs available at the March of Dimes.

Funds are raised through each marcher collecting pledges from family, neighbours and friends. Other groups such as Legions #9 Barrick St., #560 Montreal St., #227 Bath, and #496 Sydenham, CELANESE Canada and Homestead Land Holdings supported this event through donations. Members of the general public who enjoyed the pancake breakfast also were very generous with donations.

Over the last eight years a total of \$76,700 has been raised through the efforts of the Princess of Wales' Own Regiment and other military groups.

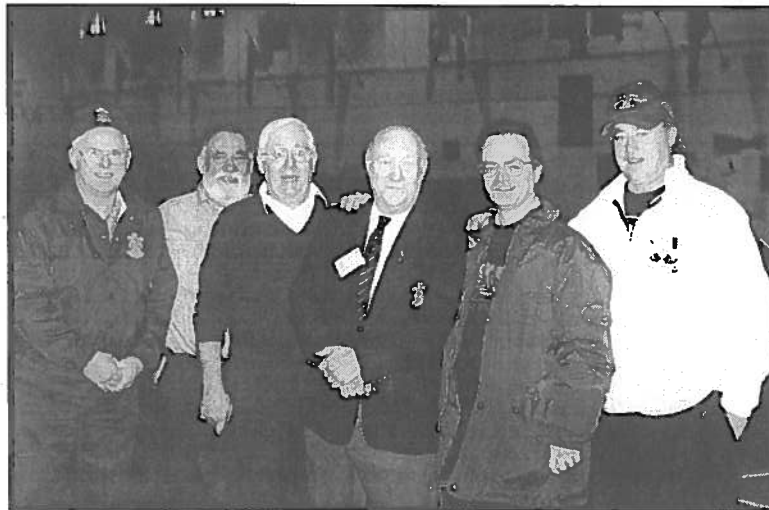

A Memorial to the Battle of Vimy Ridge

The PWOR Association was very proud to be part of the ceremonies held by the Regiment on April 9, 1998. As the reviewing officer Mr. Albert LeClaire, a veteran of WW1, was escorted onto the parade ground, you could see within his face that time was marching on, but you could also feel

the sense of pride that the battles which were fought by him and his comrades made all who attended very proud to be Canadians.

The Commanding Officer, LCol. M. Shultz, ordered a regimental salute to our honoured guest and then prayers were read by both regimental and association padres. The names of 42 soldiers from the 21st Bn who died at Vimy Ridge from the Kingston area were echoed throughout the armoury walls. As Mr. LeClaire inspected the parade, the pride in our young men and women's faces was evident as he made his way through the rank and file. Wreaths were laid at the 21st Bn memorial by our Honorary LCol. J.D. McQueen, the Commanding Officer, Mr. Bob Pollitt and the PWOR Cadet Corps. The Regiment then marched past our guest, exited through the wooden doors of the armouries and was dismissed outside.

Battle of the Somme

At Beaumont Hamel, where 80 acres of trenches are preserved, during the 1916 Battle of the Somme, the 800 strong Royal Newfoundland Regiment mounted an attack on enemy lines. After the thirty minute attack the Regiment was reduced to a total of 68 men of all ranks.

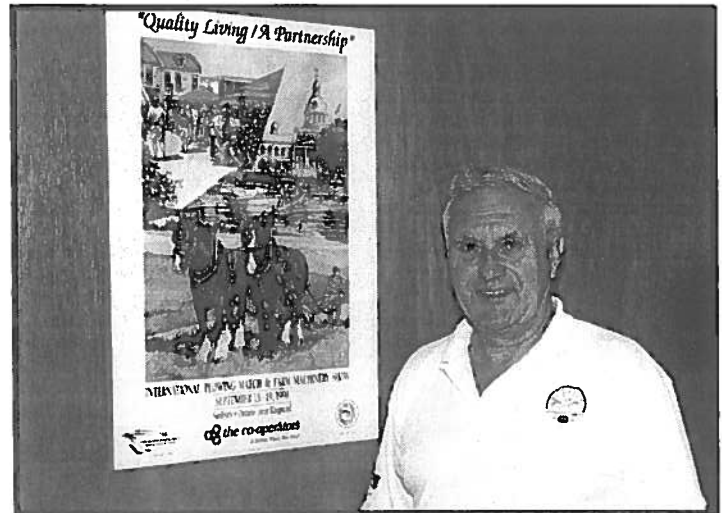
The International Plowing Match

President Bob Pollitt and his executive are urging the members of the PWOR Association to attend the International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show.

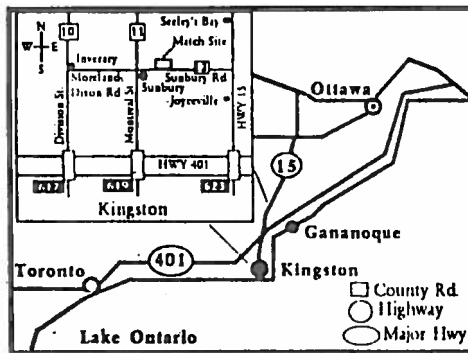

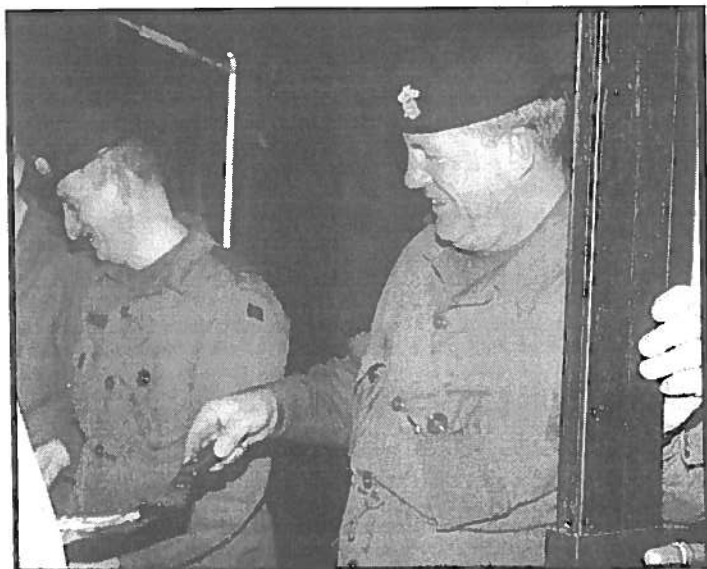
A FINAL NOTE...

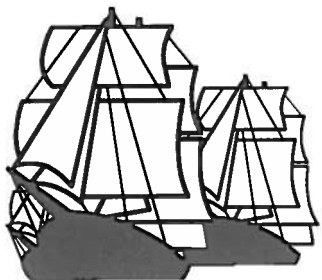
