GENERAL

1. Soldiers of the Regiment shall at all times seek to be exemplary in their soldierly duties. Field craft and marksmanship are the hallmarks of PWOR. It is within the power of every soldier of the PWOR to enhance, or to injure, the reputation of the Regiment. In addition to mastering their trade in the field, all soldiers of the Regiment shall:
 - a. acquaint themselves and comply with all regulations, rules, orders and instructions. Ignorance of orders will not be accepted as an excuse;
 - b. obey promptly, all orders given to them by a superior and carry out all assigned duties in an efficient manner;
 - c. ensure the proper care and maintenance of all public property under their control or in their possession; and,
 - d. ensure that their conduct, dress and deportment are at all times of a stander to reflect credit on themselves and the Regiment.
2. A good soldier is obedient and respectful to his superiors, lives on good terms with his comrades, has a high sense of duty to his Regiment and comrades, and takes pride in doing his work well.
3. An order given by an officer or NCO is to be obeyed instantly, without hesitation or remark. If a soldier considers himself aggrieved, he may complain or seek redress afterwards through his Company Commander, but the order must be complied with at once.
