



THE PUBLISHED HISTORIES

1. The production of a proper history of a military regiment is no small affair. The Princess of Wales' Own Regiment has been fortunate enough to have two formal published histories completed by former members. While the most recent history by Brigadier General (Ret'd) William Patterson is certainly the definitive account of the Regiment, the interested reader would do well to acquaint himself with its predecessor, by Honorary Major J.D. Mackenzie-Naughton. The published histories are as follows:

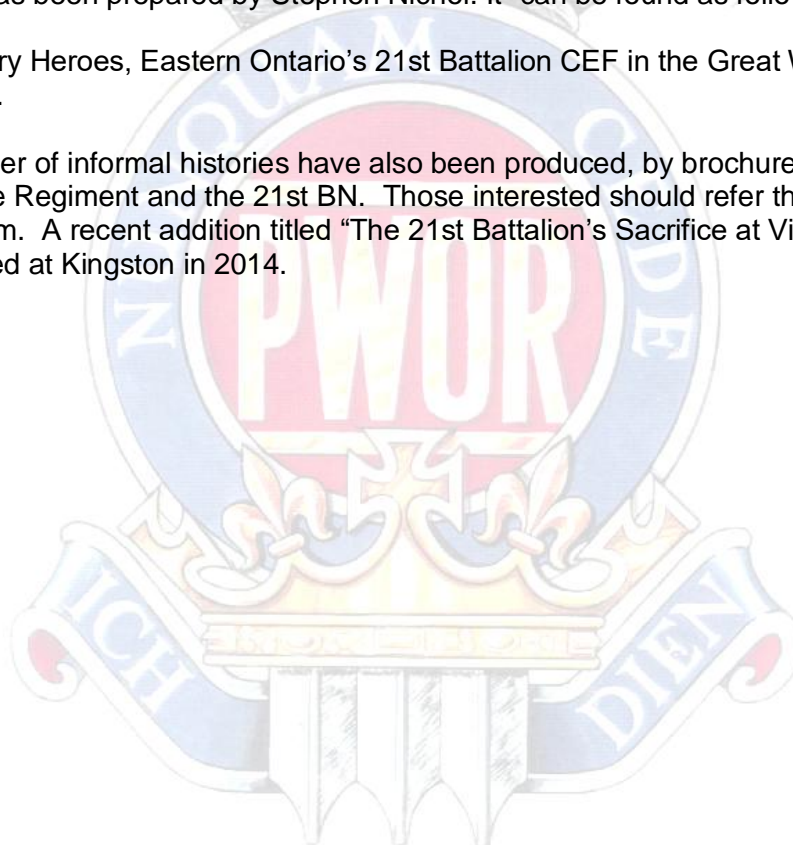
a. "The Princess of Wales' Own Regiment (M.G.)" by the Regimental Chaplain, Honorary Major J.D. Mackenzie-Naughton, published at Kingston 1946, and

b. "Kingston's Own, The Princess of Wales' Own Regiment 1863-2004" by Brigadier General (Ret'd) William Patterson, published at Kingston 2005.

2. The definitive work on the 21st BN, the Canadian Expeditionary Forces unit perpetuated by the Regiment, has been prepared by Stephen Nichol. It can be found as follows:

3. A number of informal histories have also been produced, by brochure, news article, or booklet, both on the Regiment and the 21st BN. Those interested should refer themselves to the Regimental Museum. A recent addition titled "The 21st Battalion's Sacrifice at Vimy Ridge", by Al Lloyd, was published at Kingston in 2014.
