



## WARRANT OFFICERS AND NCOS

### GENERAL

1. The Warrant Officers and Senior Non Commissioned Officers (NCOs) are the link between soldiers and Officers. They must be active, diligent and attentive to their dress and appearance at all times. Their exemplary conduct will be the standard the junior ranks look to. They shall be fully conversant with their duties and always mindful of the reputation of the Regiment.
2. Warrant Officers and NCOs shall;
  - a. acquaint themselves all articles pertaining to the performance of their duties, and shall observe and enforce all rules, orders and instructions;
  - b. show proper sense of their rank and stature in the unit, and to this end shall:
    - i. perform all duties in a prompt conscientious manner;
    - ii. maintain a respectful bearing towards their superiors;
    - iii. insist upon prompt and strict compliance with orders;
    - iv. avoid undue familiarity with their subordinates; and,
  - c. not overlook any crime or irregularity and they shall report to the proper authority any infringement of regulations, rules, orders and instructions, governing the conduct of any person subject to the Code of Service Discipline.
3. NCOs must recollect that they are chosen persons in positions of responsibility, and must learn to distinguish between the natural friendliness which should be a feature of relationships between all ranks of the Regiment and that over-familiarity which prejudices discipline.
4. In a Regiment that prides itself on field craft and marksmanship, the NCO is the key appointment that will ensure we continue to meet every objective.
